

Standard L^AT_EX Article

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This document illustrates the appearance of an article created with the shell **Standard L^AT_EX Article** or the shell **Blank - Standard L^AT_EX Article**. Both shells produce documents with centered title information, left-justified headings, theorem environments, and appendices.

The standard L^AT_EX shells provide the most general and portable set of document features. You can achieve almost any typesetting effect by beginning with a standard shell and adding L^AT_EX packages as necessary. (Pitson 1978), (Aamport 1986) and (Mittelbach, Goossens, Braams & Carlisle 2004 (second edition)).
